The Hamner Theater presents Imaginary Letters: Mozart Remembered

Nellysford, VA (Sept. 28, 2010) - The Hamner Theater announces the opening of Imaginary Letters: Mozart Remembered, adapted by Peter Coy from the book by Michael White, onstage for 6 performances, Fridays - Sundays, from October 8th to 17th.

Imaginary Letters: Mozart Remembered explores the influence Mozart's life had on his music, interweaving remembrances of Mozart told in letters written by his wife Constanzi, son Franz, cousin Anna and associates Salieri & Schikaneder. An original play adapted for the stage by Peter Coy from the book by Michael White, it was originally commissioned for the Wintergreen Summer Music Festival, where it received its world premiere in July, 2010. Juilliard Professor Michael White has drawn upon a lifetime of research, teaching, listening, and -- most of all -- admiring and loving Mozart and his music to paint this poignant & entertaining portrait of the great composer.

Saturday, October 9 will be followed by a special performance of the one-act play, Life Insurance, written & performed by Joel Jones. Admission to Life Insurance is included in the admission price for Imaginary Letters, Mozart Remembered, separate admission to Life Insurance only is \$5. About Michael White, author of Imaginary Letters: Mozart Remembered:

Michael White was born in Chicago and received his musical education at The Juilliard School, where he studied with Peter Mennin and Vincent Persichetti. He has composed music in virtually every medium, with an emphasis on vocal works. Since 1979 he has been a member of the graduate faculty at The Juilliard School, where for ten years he served as the chair of the Department of Literature and Materials of Music.

Although he also teaches such graduate courses as "Chamber Music" and "20th Century Opera", Michael White's area of expertise has always been the life and music of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. He has described this subject as "a true obsession", and as his "first and last love".

About Peter Coy:

Co-artistic director of the Hamner Theater, Peter Coy has worked in the theater for 35 years in New York, Washington, and elsewhere in the U.S. as a director, a producer, a playwright, and a stage manager. He has directed more than thirty productions, everything from Tennessee Williams to an opera/drama adaptation of

Sophocles to improvisational evenings to experimental musicals to Shakespeare and Brecht. He has written 22 full-length plays including: A HOUSE IN THE COUNTRY (Charter Theatre, Washington, DC. – recipient of 2000 Helen Hayes Award for The Outstanding New Play), POE AND ALL THAT JAZZ and BUILDING A BOAT (Charter Theater), THE WILDMAN (Theatre at Lime Kiln, Lexington, VA), AN ISLAND OF NO LAND AT ALL (Keegan Theatre, Washington, DC), BREAK IN (Windowpane Theater, NYC).

Three idiosyncratic characters — an insurance salesman, a volunteer firefighter, and a standardized test instructor — tell of a fatal motorcycle crash on a rural Virginia road. Rapidly switching between interwoven monologues, with vivid details and unexpected points of view, Life Insurance creates a tragicomic world of restless intensity and stubborn hopes.

Joel Jones is a writer and performer from Charlottesville, VA, now based in New York City. Joel has worked as a dramaturg, director, producer, set designer, guitarist, and playwright-in-residence for various theater groups, while also working as a limousine driver, short order cook, bartender and carpenter to keep from starving. His favorite job was teaching English in the Czech Republic. Joel's plays have been produced in Virginia, Boston, New York and once at a scientific research station in Antarctica.
